## State Park System now accepting applications for accessible cabins

How would you like to enjoy the great outdoors in the comfort of a fully accessible cabin in the state parks of Wisconsin? If this is something that sounds appealing to you and your family, now is the time to submit your application.

Beginning January 10, 2003, the Wisconsin (WI) State Park System, via the WI Department of Natural Resources will accept applications for the four fully accessible cabins and the two wheelchair accessible "rustic" cabins. The four fully accessible cabins feature an accessible bathroom, complete with roll-in shower, as well as an accessible kitchen, bedroom and living room. The two "rustic" cabins are one-room 13' x 13' units and can accommodate up to four. Cabins fill up quickly, so get your applications in as soon as possible!

## Funding resource for assistive technology available to Wisconsin residents with disabilities

Independence First in partnership with Marshall and Ilsley Bank, has developed WisLoan, an "alternative loan program for Wisconsin citizens with disabilities who desire to purchase assistive devices / services or make accessible modifications to their homes."

According to the WisLoan Fact Sheet, Assistive Technology is "any item, piece of equipment or device that enables an individual with a disability to improve his or her independence and quality of life."

Participating banks offer low-interest loans up to \$30,000. However, each qualifying individual will be offered a lending plan that fits their unique circumstances. While credit history need not be perfect, every borrower must have the ability to repay the loan. Eligible applicants will be a Wisconsin resident over 18 years of age and have a disability or a family member with a disability. Beginning January 22, 2003 classes will meet in the evenings once a week for six weeks for a nominal fee of \$30.00. The portal provides access to disability-related information and programs available from a variety of government agencies.

The website offers direct links to information on such issues as civil rights, education, employment, housing, health, income support, technology, transportation, and community life.
